



Event Patron and Performer Safety Policy

(updated as of March 11, 2022)

The Arts & Learning Conservatory (ALC) is committed to providing the safest environment possible for all student performers and event/performance patrons. In light of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and out of an abundance of caution to maintain the health and wellbeing of all, the ALC Board of Trustees enacts the following procedures for student performers, school staff members working events, and event/performance patrons, effective immediately.

Event Patrons:

- All ticket holders/attendees will be strongly recommended to wear a medical-grade N95, KN95, or KF94 mask during events and performances. If a ticket holder/attendee does not have a N95, KN95, or KF94 mask, one will be provided upon request.
- All ticket holders/attendees must be free of symptoms consistent with COVID-19***** in order to attend the event.

Student Performers:

- Testing shall be conducted for all student performers and crew, regardless of vaccination status.
- Student performers and crew shall engage in weekly testing, on a schedule established by administration.
- ALC shall utilize an FDA-approved test to evaluate an individual's COVID-19 status.
- Student performers and crew must be free of symptoms consistent with COVID-19***** in order to perform.
- Student performers and crew who fail to participate in weekly testing are responsible for providing proof, satisfactory to ALC, of a negative COVID-19 test*** before the scheduled performance in order to participate.
- ALC staff participating in performances will participate in weekly COVID-19 testing.
- There may be limited exemptions. Each such request will be addressed individually pursuant to current law.

** This policy is in effect as of March 12, 2022 and is subject to change without advance notice depending on subsequent orders of the CDPH, the governor, and other state or local officials.*

***** Symptoms Consistent With COVID-19:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
