GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES

The Choreographer position for ALC's youth theater programs carries a multi-faceted function of working with the theatrical director and music director creating a performance of high quality. Choreographers attend rehearsals and create dances that align with the vision of the director once or twice weekly.

Excellent communication and reporting skills are required. Also essential for the success of the production is the following: Translating the Director's vision into dance movement that is suitable for all levels of dance experience. Researching specific styles of dance (where appropriate).Running dance auditions for dance-oriented leads and chorus. Assisting the Director, Musical Director with casting the show. Planning movements to the music in collaboration with the Music Director. Teaching the cast and chorus all dances, and coordinating all additional movement as needed. Communicating movement needs to the Costumer during tech rehearsals and shows.
